

Operation Round Up, a charitable program unique to electric co-ops, is designed to provide financial assistance to non-profit or community-based organizations that demonstrate a commitment to enhancing the quality of life in the local area served by Itasca-Mantrap.

The Operation Round Up® Trust Board recently awarded \$44,000 in Operation Round Up grants for 80 civic projects in the Itasca-Mantrap and surrounding areas. Applications received indicated a need for more than \$138,000.

Since the program's inception in 2006, the Operation Round Up Trust Board of Directors has awarded more than \$1.3 million to local organizations. The Operation Round Up Trust Board meets twice a year to select grant recipients from the applications received. Operation Round Up is possible thanks to the generosity of Itasca-Mantrap members.

The next application deadline for Operation Round Up is Monday, September 16, 2024.


