that demonstrate a commitment to enhancing the quality of life in the region. Contributions are distributed primarily in the local area served by Itasca-Mantrap. Local organizations that have received Operation Round Up grant funding include the Akeley Regional Community Center, local fire departments, local food shelves, and senior meals to name a few.

One of our seven cooperative principles is "concern for community." These principles define who we are as an organization. The concern for community principle was evident when Itasca-Mantrap first brought electricity to this community in 1939. The quality of life immediately improved. But we all know a community needs more than just electricity and Itasca-Mantrap has been at the forefront of bringing other improvements to this area. Operation Round Up was created for this very purpose.

To date, Itasca-Mantrap members have donated nearly \$1.2 million dollars to local families, individuals, and charities through the Operation Round Up program. Across the country, more than 350 electric co-ops have an Operation Round-Up program. Together we have raised millions for our local communities. This is proof that small donations from members like you can make a substantial impact.

Automated Phone Options

Due to the growth in our area, we have had an increase in phone calls. Our phone system will be adapting accordingly, to better streamline calls and increase efficiency for our members' inquiries. When calling in, our members will be given a few options to help direct their call to the proper department. Members will be asked to press 1 to report an outage, press 2 to make a payment over the phone, or press 3 to speak with an Itasca-Mantrap representative.

Sales Tax Exemption

Members who use electricity as their primary source of residential heat are exempt from paying taxes on the electricity purchased during the billing months of November through April. If more than one type of heat is used, electricity is not taxable only if it is the primary source of heat for the largest period of time during the heating season.

To apply for the sales tax exemption, Members must complete the exemption form, available at www.itasca-mantrap.com or in our office. If you have already applied for a sales tax exemption, there is no need to re-apply; your enrollment will automatically carry forward each year.



Note: Potential for Increased Morning Control

This past heating season we experienced the addition of morning load control for dual fuel and water heating. We expect to see more of that this heating season as early morning peaks are occurring due to low morning temperatures. Morning control events tend to occur between 6 a.m. and 10 a.m. Members on these programs can check our website for load management updates.

Load Control Notifications

Load management is an approach by which the peak demand of electric energy can be curtailed to allow better use of existing generating capacity. Lowering the peak benefits all members by reducing our wholesale power cost. These savings are passed along to participating members through lower rates on our dual fuel and off peak programs. New systems may also be eligible for installation rebates. Contact our office to learn more about our load management programs.

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

Is your home heating system ready for the winter chill? One of the easiest ways to keep your system running efficiently is to regularly replace filters. If your central air system has a furnace filter, it should be replaced about every 90 days.

If your home is heated through warm-air registers, baseboard heaters or radiators, remember to clean them regularly to boost efficiency.
